<u>Topic</u>

This half term, Year 5 will be venturing thousands of years back in time to the Ancient Egyptians. We will be looking at famous Egyptian architecture, the mummification process and the role of men and women. History in Year 5 focuses on using primary and secondary sources of information to reveal the secrets of the past. We will look at one of the most famous female leaders in history. Cleopatra, who was a pharaoh in 51 BC, was the last pharaoh of Egypt before the Romans invaded in 30 BC.

We will go on a trip to Leicester Museums and Art Gallery to experience authentic Ancient Egyptian artefacts. We cannot wait!



Book recommendation

Secrets of a Sun King—Emma Carrol



A discovery from ancient Egypt . . . A cursed package . . . The untold story of a young pharaoh . . .

The mysterious death of a Professor of Middle Eastern art, connected with her own grandfather, sparks the journey of a lifetime for Lilian. She must return the priceless and secret remains of **Tutankhamen** to his true tomb and try to release her grandfather from their suspected curse.

<u>English</u>

This half term in English, we begin by writing a newspaper report about the discovery of Ancient Egyptian artefacts. We will recap the use of a full range of punctuation, including inverted commas, using informal language and recognising vocabulary of informal speech.

Next, we will re-write a narrative from the 'Secrets of the Sun King', focussing on action, dialogue, using nouns and adjectives to enhance meaning. Also, we will look in detail at how an adverb can give extra information about a verb, including how, when, how often an action takes place.

Finally, we will write an explanation text describing how bodies were mummified during the Ancient Egyptian times. We will use a variety of complex sentences with a range of subordinating conjunctions, vary the order of subordinate clauses in a sentence and use commas after a subordinate clause at the end of a sentence.

<u>Homework</u>

All children will be given homework every Friday. This must be completed by the following Wednesday. Homework given will always be a reconsolidation of learning that has taken place in school.

In addition to this, a homework menu will



be provided each half term. These tasks will cover a range of skills. Children can choose as many additional tasks as they like to fit in with their busy schedules at home.

Maths

In our maths lessons this term, we will be continuing build on our knowledge and understanding of place value. We will be learning how to recognise the value of digits in up to 6 figure numbers. This will also include: comparing and ordering numbers, rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000 and counting forwards and backwards in negative numbers.

We will also be practising our writing methods of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. This will include: adding and subtracting numbers with more than 4-digits, investigating factors, prime numbers, square numbers and cube numbers and multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000.

We will also continue with our big push on times-tables, as these form an important basis for many areas of the maths curriculum. Please encourage

your child to access TT Rockstars as often as possible to support them with this essential knowledge. The children's usernames can be found in their Partnership and Homework books.

with the same

be tested in school

the following Friday.
