After it has been raining, have a look outside. Can you see any snails? Have a look at the patterns on their shells. What do you notice? Are there any with similar patterns? Snail shell patterns are inherited from their parents. Can you find a potential family of snails? Have a go at sketching some of the patterns you see. Relax and practise mindfulness at home by taking part in Yoga.

Research the history of your own family and create your own family tree.
