Go on a minibeast hunt in your garden, park or other outside area. Try looking under plant pots or stones, on leaves and bushes or on some flowers. Take a photo or draw the minibeasts you find.

Make a minibeast out of your recycling. You could use cardboard boxes and tubes, yoghurt pots or plastic bottles. You could make a butterfly, worm, ladybird or spider or choose your own minibeast to make.

Draw or paint a picture of a butterfly. Can you make the wings symmetrical? Tell an adult at home about the life cycle of a butterfly.

I must try to...

- Read every day and ask an adult to sign my partnership book.
- Practise my harder to read and spell words
- Try and complete one of these extra optional tasks each week.

Try growing some plants or flowers at home. You could try planting some seeds in a pot or in your garden. Remember to water your seeds and put them somewhere sunny.

Go on a shape hunt. Can you spot any circles, triangles, squares, rectangles, pentagons, hexagons or octagons?

Go on a spring walk, what signs of spring can you spot? Can you draw what you saw?
