Welcome back!

This half term in Saplings Class our topic is 'Circus and Celebrations'.



The children will firstly be finding out some facts about the festival of Diwali and be encouraged to begin to develop an understanding that not everyone celebrates the same festivals and that people have different ways of celebrating.

The children will also have the opportunity to link the timing of the Diwali festival with the current autumn season. The children will be prompted to observe the visual changes that take place at this time of year as well as sharing their ideas and asking questions about the natural world around them and the forces they might feel outside.

The children will then be provided with lots of opportunities for developing their physical skills as they begin our 'Circus' topic. The children will be provided with activities to develop their balance and coordination skills through a range of 'circus style' activities. The children will find out about different aspects of circus life and the types of circus performers.

Towards the end of the term to topic focus will move towards the Christmas celebration. The children will be finding out about the first Nativity and investigate how Christmas is celebrated in relation to other festivals.

Book recommendation

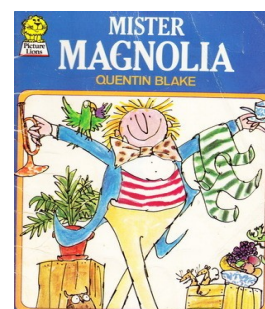
Mr Magnolia

Literacy/Communication and Language

The children will be reading the stories 'The Fabulous Foskett Family Circus', 'Biscuit Bear', 'It was a Dark Dark Night', 'The First Christmas' and 'Stickman'.

The children will be encouraged to listen attentively to our stories.

The children will be encourage to continue to develop their awareness of the different features that a book has eg title, cover, words, pictures as well as who the author and illustrator are and what they do. In writing the children will be prompted to continue to talk about and create marks to express something specific.

As always the children will be guided to look at the person who is speaking to them, wait their turn to speak and to try and answer in simple sentences.

Maths

In our maths lessons this term, we will be continuing to practise written methods of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

This will include: working with numbers with up to two decimal places, learning how to interpret a remainder as a decimal and fraction and using the order of operations to solve problems. Following this, we will be investigating common factors, common multiples, prime, square and cube numbers.

We will also continue with our big push on times-tables, as these form an important basis for many areas of the maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to access TT Rockstars as often as possible to support them with this essential knowledge.

This term we will be re-starting our reading reward system. Each class will become 'Reading Rocketeers' aiming to get to 'space' (200 reads) by the end of the academic year. Children are encouraged to read at home every day and to make a note in their partnership book every time they read outside of school. After every 20 reads, they will get one step closer to space and will be rewarded with a token which they can 'spend' on prizes and, of course, books!
