The Glapton Academy Year 3/4 Newsletter Autumn Term 1 - 2022



Topic

This half term, we will be learning about the Vikings. We will begin by understanding where the Vikings originated from and who they were. We will be looking at different stereotypes of the Vikings. Different historical sources often have varying views about the Vikings. We will discuss the validity of each source and form our own conclusions.

Furthermore, we will learn about the key dates in the Viking Britain timeline, such as raids, battles and captured towns. One town, called York, will be our main focus. We will learn how the Vikings lived and what role each citizen had in the 8th century. We will also learn about the Viking's preferred method of travel: the Long Boat. We will then compare the Vikings to the Romans and discuss the impact that the Viking rule had on Britain.




Book recommendation:

Homework

All children will be given homework every Friday. This must be completed by the following Wednesday. Homework given will always be a reconsolidation of learning that has taken place in school.

In addition to this, a homework menu will be provided each half term. These tasks will cover a range of skills. Children can choose as many additional tasks as they like to fit in with their busy schedules at home.



English

We will focus on three text types this half term. Firstly, children will be writing step-by-step instructions detailing how to be a Viking in line with our topic book. We plan to construct sentences using the correct punctuation marks. We will also explore different sentence types such as statements, questions, exclamations and commands. Children will use time adverbials and imperative verbs to improve their writing.

We will also look at producing a narrative retelling of our topic book. The children will identify and use adverbs. Children will also develop their understanding of main clauses.

Towards the end of term, we will look at Kenning poetry based around seasons and weather. We will be looking at how to use verbs, nouns and determiners in order to make writing more effective. We will also explore a range of poetic devices and figurative language such as alliteration, rhyme, similes, metaphors and personification.

In reading, we will be working on building our vocabulary so that we can use new words in our writing. We will be retrieving information from a text to help us to better understand a story. We will be working cooperatively to develop our reading skills.

Maths

In our maths lessons this term, we will begin by understanding the values of each digit when they are in different columns. We will look at 3 digit numbers and 4 digit numbers. We will be able to read and interpret number lines marked in multiples of 1s, 10s, 100s, 100os and round numbers to the nearest 100 or 100o. Year Fours will progress to negative numbers and how we can count backwards when using them. After focusing on place value, we will begin looking at addition and subtraction. We will focus on counting on a number line first, then progress to using part whole models and column methods.

We will also continue with our big push on times-tables, as these form an important basis for many areas of the maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to access TT Rockstars as often as possible to support them with this essential knowledge. Usernames for TT Rockstars can be found in the children's Partnership books.
