We are super proud of all of our children; every single one of them gave their very best.



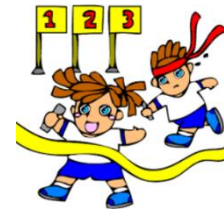

## Class Assemblies

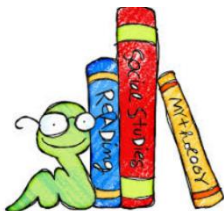
We finished the year with class assemblies from Chestnut, Beech and Walnut. As always, we are so pleased we can share your children's learning with you and hope you enjoyed joining in.

## Book Fair



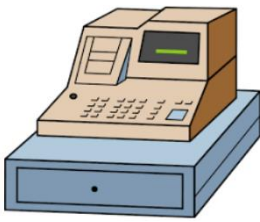

Over £800 was raised, which will be used to enhance playtimes and lunchtimes for the children. Last year's money was used to provide tubs of brand-new games for wet play times for every class.
