Dear Parent and Carers,

Homework Packs

We hope you are enjoying your homework packs and keeping yourselves busy. I'm sure your children are enjoying the choice of activities we have made available so that they can learn at home.

During this time of uncertainty and change, it is important to remember that children will benefit from structured days that integrate learning, fun and relaxation.
