We have been boosting our messages on 'Healthy Eating' with the support of our SNAG (School Nutrition Action Group) team.

Children in F2 and KS1 are being encouraged to eat all of their vegetables and earn their 'Clean Plate' award. They are wowing us with their discovery of new work

foods they now love!

The Government have recently announced the findings of a research project in The Netherlands. The research evidenced a huge improvement in the eating habits of fussy eaters and increased health outcomes through schools using rewards and incentives for healthy choices.

This is what we do already at Glapton with our Clean Plate Awards, 5-a-day awards, Healthy Lunchbox and Healthy Dinner awards and other incentives such as Golden Table.

Obesity is identified as a local problem contributing to limited life expectancy and an increase in adult disease statistics. By encouraging healthy eating choices at school we are doing our bit to prevent our children becoming obese adults.

The most successful way of doing this is through providing a hot, healthy free school meal to all of our youngest children.

PLEASE BE CLEAR THAT WE DO NOT MAKE MONEY FROM THE UNIVERSAL FREE SCHOOL MEAL SCHEME. The funding received from the government pays for the cost of the provision of the meals.
