Core Knowledge and Key Visuals

Nottingham castle was first built in 1067Ad out of wood. It was later replaced with a stone castle during the reign of Henry II. It was destroyed during the civil war and a mansion was built in its place in 1674.

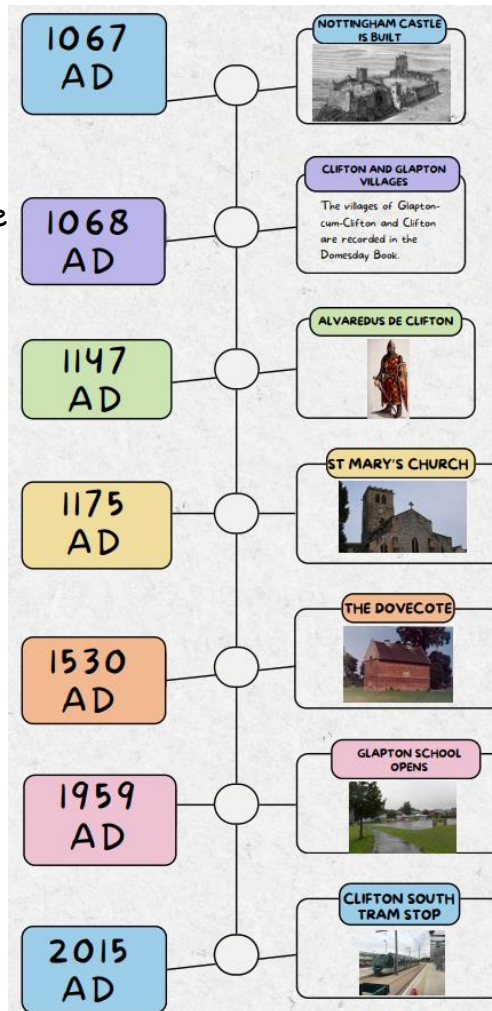
Modern day Clifton was made up of the village of Clifton and Clifton-cum-Glapton. They were mentioned in the Domesday book in 1068AD.

Alvaredus de Clifton was the first Norman knight to live in Clifton. He was the warden of Nottingham Castle.

St Mary's Church was first built in the 12th century and it has one of the oldest surviving decorative cross from before the civil war.

Some significant buildings in Clifton are the Dovecote (1530 AD), the Blacksmith's Forge (1879AD), Clifton Hall (13th Century and Clifton School (1871AD).

The Glapton Academy opened in March 1959 as Glapton Infants School with 8 members of staff.
