

My Wonderful World



We will begin this half term by looking at maps of our world. We will learn that there are lots of different countries in the world and will use maps to discover that some of them are very far away.

After this, we will learn about the features of some different biomes (desert, forest, rainforest, savannah and oceans). We will classify animals living in these areas and will be able to talk about the features animals have to allow them to live in these areas.

We will then spend time learning about the lifestyle of people in some of these places. We will investigate foods, clothing, languages, culture and significant buildings.

We will finish off the year by learning about summer and will be able to compare all 4 seasons, talking about the differences between them.

Homework

A homework menu will be provided each half term which can be found on our class page of the website as well as on dojo. These tasks will cover a range of skills.



Children can choose as many additional tasks as they like. They will receive 5 dojos for each activity completed. Don't forget to send us photos on dojo. We love to see what they have been learning at home!

English

This half term we will continue to work on our sentence writing skills and will write lots of different sentences using our phonics and knowledge of harder to read and spell words. We will continue to work on the basic skills needed for writing sentences including oral rehearsal, finger spaces, capital letters and full stops.

We will be reading a range of non-fiction books to help us with our learning in topic and will be answering comprehension questions using the text.



Maths

In Maths this half term, we will begin by working on doubling. Children will use manipulatives to calculate doubles of numbers to 10 (e.g. knowing that $4 + 4 = 8$).

We will then move on to halving and sharing where children will be able to use objects to find half of amounts to 10 then share amounts equally in practical activities.

After this, we will be cementing our knowledge of number bonds to 5. Children need to be able to recall addition and subtraction facts for all numbers to 5 so we will be working hard to make sure we are fluent in this area.

Finally, we will be ending the year by learning to use everyday language related to time.
