

Homework

All children will be given homework every Friday. This must be completed and handed in by the following Thursday. Homework will be an opportunity for children to consolidate their learning in Maths and English that has taken place in school. This will be set weekly. For each new block of learning, we will also provide a homework mat, which will cover a range of different subjects and skills that will compliment the children's learning in school.

Homework Mat

- Choose a book that is special to you and share it with a younger sibling and a friend. See if they enjoy the story as much as you do.
- Create a fact file about yourself for our class book.
- Set your own homework task linked to our History topic - Crime and Punishment.
- I must try to...
 - Read every day and have my partnership book signed.
 - Practise my spellings and times tables.
 - Try and complete one of the optional tasks each week.
- Take charge of the recycling in your house for the week! Are there any changes you can make as a family?
- Learn how to say hello and goodbye in five different languages.
- Create a 'Wanted poster' for a fictional criminal.
- Imagine you are in charge of the country and write a set of laws. How would someone be punished if they broke a law?
- Bring something into school that represents you as a person - let's see if we can guess who it belongs to!
- Set yourself three life skills challenges for this half term. Eg learn basic first aid, how to safely make a hot drink, learn your parents phone numbers.
- Challenge your maths knowledge by playing Countdown.
- Research our First Science Topic - The Circulatory System.

English

This half term, some of our writing will be based on 'The Gigantic Turnip' by Alexi Tolstoy.



We will be writing explanation texts, recounts and a non-chronological report.

Explanation Text—We will be writing about how beans grow. We will be focusing on present tense and apostrophes for possession.

Recount— To use a range of time connectives to show when an event is happening (First, Next, After that, Finally). To use apostrophes to contract some words (did not to didn't).

Non-Chronological Report—About James Wong (a botanist). We will be focusing on plurals s and es and tenses.



Maths

This half term, Year 1 will be looking at the place value to 50 and 100. They will also be working on position and direction and money, recognising different coins and notes and their value. As well as this, they will also be learning to tell the time to o'clock and half past.

Year 2 will be focusing on statistics, position and direction and a little bit more practise on telling the time so that they are ready for Year 3.

Please keep working on addition and subtraction at home as the quicker they can recall addition facts (especially number bonds to 10) the easier many areas of the maths curriculum becomes, which will help them tremendously through their time at Glapton.

When it comes to times tables, we will continue with counting in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s. Please encourage your child to access Times Table Rockstars as often as possible to give them an introduction times tables.
