


### **Book recommendation**

#### <u>Maths</u>

This half term in maths, we will be carrying our some exciting mathematical projects!

These projects will provide us with an opportunity to revisit many of the skills and curriculum content covered both in Year 6 and also the rest of Key Stage 2.

The projects will allow children to explore maths in real life contexts, enabling them to see how important maths is in all as-

pects of life. They will also provide a great opportunity to explore and develop enterprise.

Our first exciting project will centre around the Glapton Bakery! By the end of the project, children will have made their own cupcakes and created their own packaging for them too! We will be covering lessons involving: scaling recipes; cost efficiency; and profit and loss!
